Annex to Para Cross Invitation

1. Additional Information to the events

1.1 Accuracy Parachuting Jumps

Rules according to Sporting Code Section 5 and S&A competition rules IPC/FAI and Austrian competition rules.
2 cm DCD – measurement up to 500 cm.

Points: total distance in cm is converted to points according to following table

3 – 5 rounds finished:

0 cm = 1400 Points	1 -	10 cm =	20	Points deducted per cm
30 cm = 1000 Points	11 -	20 cm =	12	Points deducted per cm
	21 -	29 cm =	8	Points deducted per cm
	31 -	79 cm =	5	Points deducted per cm
	80 -	149 cm =	2	Points deducted per cm
	150 -	499 cm =	1	Points deducted per cm
	500 -	1028 cm =	0,5	Points deducted per cm

1-2 completed rounds:

0 cm = 1400 Points	1 -	5 cm =	40	Points deducted per cm
15 cm = 1000 Points	6 -	10 cm =	24	Points deducted per cm
	11 -	14 cm =	16	Points deducted per cm
	16 -	39 cm =	10	Points deducted per cm
	40 -	74 cm =	4	Points deducted per cm
	75 -	249 cm =	2	Points deducted per cm
	250 -	500 cm =	1	Points deducted per cm

examples:

000 cm =	1400 points after 3 – 5 and	1400 points after 1 – 2 completed rounds
015 cm =	1140	1000
100 cm =	713	568

If due to Weather conditions not even 1 round can be finished, there will be no overall winners declared.



1.2 Orienteering

Distance 5 to 6 km ,10 control points, IOF-map scale 1:15.000, control points already marked on the map.

Maps are handed over at pre start (1 min before start)

Individual start interval 2 minutes

Starting order according to team accuracy

Each teams 1st competitor starts first followed by 2nd and 3rd

Start order within teams to be determined by teams.

Points: average time of best 5 competitors + 10% = Ideal time = 1000 points
Each 2 seconds slower than Ideal time 0,5 point deducted.
Each 2 seconds faster than Ideal time 1 point added.

example: winner 40' -1240 Points
Ideal time 48' -1000 Points
58' - 850 Points
1:20' - 520 Points
1:56' 10 Points

1.3 shooting

Int. Standard Match Rifle on international .22 – rifle target (10 Ring).

distance 50 m, laying & free (no belt or other aids).

5 rounds training/centering- and 20 rounds competition.

Each team is shooting together, time for all 25 shots will be 25 minutes

Rifles are provided by organizer, own weapons are allowed, if they fulfil the ISSF standard requirements,

Points: 200 rings - 1400 points
Each ring less- 15 points deducted

example: 180 rings - 1100 points
160 rings - 800 points
140 rings - 500 points
120 rings - 200 points
110 rings - 50 points
109 rings - 35 points
108 rings - 20 points
107 rings - 5 points
106 rings
and less - 0 Points



2. Overall

2.1 Individual overall

Sum of all points is the total score, winner is the competitor with the highest total score.

In case of a tie, the better result in one event will apply, in case of a still further tie, the competitor with the better result in accuracy will be the winner

Individual overall ranking will be calculated only for competitors who have started in all three events.

2.2. Team Overall

Total points of all three team members are added to get the team score.

Winner is the team with the highest total score.

Team Results are only given if all three team members have achieved an individual overall score.

3. Awards

All winners, second and third placed competitors will get prizes
